






## BIENVENID@S A COSTA RICA





- Medicines & contact lens solution
- Neutral and interchangeable clothing & comfortable shoes
- Something to make your room more cozy
- Raincoat/Umbrella (or plan to buy one there)
- Multiple forms of payment
- Tampons in Costa Rica



### **Staying in Contact While Abroad**

### **CELL PHONE PLAN:**

- Make sure that your phone is Unlocked
- Use wifi at SJO airport to confirm arrival with family
- Wait to purchase a local SIM card in Turrialba with staff
- Keep phone charged
- Keep hard copy of important numbers
- Campus address





### Carry on:

- Passport + copy
- Vaccination card + copy
- Cash(\$5, \$10, \$20 USD)
- Credit or debit card
- Lithium ion batteries
- Panama bus ticket



## **Packing Tips:** What To Avoid

### WE RECOMMEND YOU DO NOT BRING:

- Prized possessions: heirloom jewelry, irreplaceable tokens, etc. It's not worth the risk of losing an item.
- Too many clothes chances are you'll want to acquire some new stuff!
- Adaptors for Europe (but three to two flat prongs may be useful)
- Locked cell phones



### **Documents for Customs**

### **REMEMBER TO CARRY:**

- Your Passport!
- Proof of Onward Travel (bus ticket to Panama)
- Address for CATIE
- Photocopies of your PASSPORT and printout of your CISI (medical insurance) card.

# When should I arrive at SJO airport?

**August 28, 2023** 

Required arrival window of time: 12 noon - 8 PM

If you scheduled an arrival later than the designated time:

 You will not get to use the free Verto shuttle. You will have to take private transportation, and this will include a fee of \$200.00.

#### If your flight is unexpectedly delayed due to airline/weather:

- Stay in touch with Verto Costa Rica support. We will help you get to campus.
- You will not pay the \$200 transportation fee.

#### If you scheduled an arrival earlier than the designated time:

- Stay in touch with Verto Costa Rica support.
- Be sure to return to the airport during the 12:00 noon 2:00 PM window. If not, you will need private transportation and this will include a fee of \$200.00.



# What to do when you arrive in SJO Airport?

Wear your Verto T-shirt

Leave plane WITH your carry-on and documents!

Go through

- Immigration
- Baggage claim
- Customs (bags go through x-ray machine)

Only one exit (hectic - Taxi, taxi taxi...)

Look for Verto Staff in Verto T-shirts, and follow their instructions



## Where is my bag?

- If you don't find your suitcase
  - 1. Report this to Verto Costa Rica Support
    - costarica@vertoeducation.org
  - 2. Make a claim in baggage claim before departing the airport
    - Be sure to include Verto Costa Rica Support in the claim form (we will help you to navigate the process to get your bag back)

- **Early arrivals:** go back to the airport or arrive on campus at an arranged time

#### TIPS FOR LIFE IN COSTA RICA:

- Situational Awareness and Safety:
- Go with others. Buddy system
- Cell phone at all times
- Verto Safe App- independent travel
- Be discrete with cash and valuables/electronics
- Know before you go
- Let others know where you're going
- Drink safety- don't accept drinks from strangers



## **Alcohol Safety**

## FOLLOWING YOUR CODE OF RESPONSIBILITY:

- If 18, you are legally allowed to consume alcohol in Costa Rica (not possess it in Verto facilities)
- You are NOT permitted to use alcohol in an irresponsible way or to abuse alcohol
- Being a "drunken American" wandering the streets puts you and your peers in a vulnerable situation
- Code of responsibility violations can lead to serious consequences up to dismissal



# **ACTIVITIES OFF CAMPUS:** Trips to town


- Turrialba is only 2.5 miles away

#### **BUDGETING**


- Tuition includes all meals and academic excursions!
- Students pay for: laundry, dining out, independent travel, medical bills, personal needs.
- Student Budget Guidelines (depends on the individual)
  - Independent Travel: \$300-\$1000 (could be more!)
  - \$250 per month (average monthly spend of former students) Laundry, medication up front, dining out.
